Identification, nature of damage and management of different potential insect pests of maize prevalent in the district were deliberated upon during the programme. Maize cut worm, stem borer, Fall

Army warm and several other insects posing thereat to the maize crop were discussed.

The participants were also trained about different management practices including cultural, chemical, biological and use of pheromone traps/lures for further extending the knowhow and do how to the farmers level. Komal Sharma deliberated in detail on the stem borer and fall armyworms.
